President report:

This year as president went by quickly and it has been an honor to once again serve in this position. As always, I am thankful for our board

and committees that make things happen. Advocacy and promoting our RTs in the state of Kansas is paramount. The ASRT "Be Seen" campaign has been a big hit in getting to be recognized, especially as front-line workers. KSRT now is looking to follow up on that idea with a video for Kansas. If you know someone who can work, preferably donate, their time to helping make that video please contact me at mmcaldwell@aol.com.

Second, many states are adding radiologist assistants into their legislation, and we have begun that process in Kansas. In January 2026 we will have a Day on the Hill in Topeka, because many of our legislators do not understand who we are and the importance of our profession. Everyone is welcome to join us at the Day on the Hill. As the legislative chair, I also am tasked with watching for any

encroachments of our professions, where non-technologists try to take over some of our duties. Many other states are under attack. We have been able to fight off the encroachments so far. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES

9:30 a.m. Oct. 26

Via Zoom

Voting members present: Toni Caldwell, president; Denise Orth, immediate past president and executive secretary.

Non-voting members present: Kelly Denton, president-elect; Shanna Benet, vice president; and Bella Ostmeyer, student representative.

Call to order: Toni called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m.

Quorum: Denise established a quorum.

Approval of minutes: Toni moved to approve the July meeting minutes and Denise seconded. Motion passed.

Financial report: Denise presented the financial report through Oct. 21. The report showed income of \$10,949.92 and expenses of \$7,263.88. The net worth report showed a checking account balance of \$19,912.30 and certificates of deposit worth \$47,238.25 for a total net worth of \$67,150.55. Toni moved to accept the financial report

as presented, Denise seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Old business:

ASRT Affiliate Development Program: The society decided not pursue this.

ASRT Financial Assistant Program: The application was sent in and we were awarded \$5,000.

CD renewal: The CD at Sunflower State Bank was rolled over for a new term. There was a miscommunication, and the CD was renewed for a 9-month term at 0.449%. Upon discussing this with Sunflower Bank, the CD will be redeemed early and then a 6-month CD will be purchased at 4.3%.

Executive secretary vacancy: Past presidents will be notified to solicit interest.

KSRT career video: Toni is researching the possibilities with Wash-

burn University.

New business:

ASRT senior delegates: There is one applicant.

Rad Tech Week: As membership chair, Shanna will manage the free membership contest.

Announcements:

2025 Convention: Convention will be April 3-5 in Manhattan with the theme of Invisible Heros Exposed. Selling T-shirts at the convention was discussed at the last meeting, but the full board will manage this opportunity.

The *Anode* deadline will be Nov. 11.

The winter board meeting will be Jan. 18 via Zoom, with the executive committee meeting at 9:30 a.m. and the full board at 10.

Call to order: The meeting was called to order at 10:06 a.m.

Quorum: Denise established a quorum.

Consent agenda

The consent agenda process is a tool to help speed up board meetings. If a member has a specific report they would like to discuss, there will be a vote and, if approved, that report will be added to new business and discussed. Toni asked if anyone had anything that they would like to pull from the agenda to discuss. There were no concerns or questions.

Gale Brown, chair of the board: I attended the ASRT House of Delegates on June 27-30 as an alternate delegate and submitted my report to the board. I attended the July 13 executive committee and full board meetings over Zoom. I have been trying to increase membership by reaching out to medical imaging technologists in the Southeast Kansas service area and speaking to them about the benefits of becoming a member of the KSRT.

Toni Caldwell, president and legislative chair: I have been working with KSBHA on HAPN, emailed KSBHA and the governor's office about replacing Kyle on the rad council, have been in touch with ARRT concerning RAs,

reached out to Topeka-area radiologists for RA support, need to get back with scheduling for Day at the Capital, turned in all affiliate information needed for ASRT, turned in ASRT Affiliate Assistance Program paperwork, found a few items for the silent auction, spoke with Washburn radiology students about the Student Leadership Development Program and convention, went through applications for KHA healthcare person of the year, and coordinated the July board meeting.

Jen Smith, editor of *The Rotating Anode* and media chair: Denise ordered a new laptop for me, and setup took a little while (which is why the summer issue came out in October). But the summer issue is published and online, and I'm already working on the next issue. I posted the summer *Anode* on the website as well as convention rules and vendor information.

Kelly Denton, president-elect and western area representative: In July I hosted quarterly virtual meetings with western area facilities using Pioneer Health group. Managers discussed changes in facilities, challenges with policies, staffing, supplies, radiologist remote reporting and mobile MRI that services many of the critical access facilities. For convention 2025 I have mailed or emailed the KSRT partnership forms to all previous vendors and all facilities on the KHA list, emailed numerous area vendors KSRT partnership forms and donation letters, looked up area business in Manhattan and mailed donation letters, submitted to multiple sporting groups the donation letter, and mailed the Visit Manhattan Kansas organization. They have responded with offers of promotional assistance, charging stations, printed nametags, lanyards, and welcome packets with note pads and pens.

Kirsten Oswald, professional development chair: I have contacted Tara Rohn to ensure I fully understand the position's duties and received the tote of supplies. I have revised the KSRT student competition rules doc-

ument and application form (Google Form) and created a flyer for the competition. I had Tara review the three documents before I submitted them to Jen for the *Anode*. The link for student competition applications is <https://forms.gle/pt39fsiMGSNCyqTU8>. The link is in the rules document and flyer as well. All applications should be submitted by Feb. 12. The competition includes imaging (cross table lateral hip, plantodorsal axial calcaneus, posterior oblique lumbar spine, AP axial sigmoid, and most interesting case), scientific exhibit, and research essay. Essays that are not allowed this year are Empathy in Radiology, MRI Breast Imaging and Cancer Detection, and Medical Use of Heavy Ions in Radiology. Lastly, I am currently working on sending the rules document and flyer to all program directors to give to their students. The rules and the Google form link for submissions are also posted on the website. I have attached the flyer for student competitions for everyone to view.

Denise Orth, immediate past president and fellows chair: As past president, I attended the ASRT House of Delegates on June 27-30 as the junior delegate and submitted my report to the ASRT, attended the July 13 KSRT meeting at Washburn, provided SLDP information to students to encourage them to become more involved, worked with board members to provide guidance on board business. As fellows chair, a rubric has been developed to assist the Fellows Committee in verifying information provided by applicants. Applications are due 90 days before convention, so Jan. 1 is the last day to submit applications for this year. Please encourage members who you feel are worthy of this award to contact me. I would love to discuss elevation to Fellow with them.

Becky Dodge and Dixie Copeland, education co-chairs: Since the last board meeting, the education committee has created a save-the-date notice for the 2025 convention in Manhattan,

had a superhero logo created for the 2025 KSRT convention, distributed the 2025 speaker forms to many possible speakers, and have two speakers who have submitted their speaker forms. We also contacted the Hilton Garden Inn & Convention Center in Hays to discuss a contract for the 2026 convention.

Shanna Bennett, vice president: I have been speaking to fellow radiology colleagues about KSRT memberships and explaining what we do, have been trying to recruit potential speakers for the 2025 KSRT convention, and currently am working on contacting Washburn University about having someone from Stormont-Vail talk to the radiology students about interventional radiology and cardiac cath lab and joining the KSRT after graduation.

Melinda Chiroy, scholarship: Emails about KSRT scholarships were sent to program directors. In addition to sharing flyers with students, directors were asked to share information with all clinical preceptors. This is in hopes they will in turn post and share materials with the staff at their hospitals. Scholarship information has been updated on the KSRT website and will be in the next *Rotating Anode*. Toni has shared the flyer on social media.

Kyle Ibarra, central area co-representative: Since the previous meeting I have attended the KSBHA Rad Council Meeting. I will continue to serve on this council until the governor appoints a new member. To date the council has processed 263 requests for licenses and issued 238. New applicant processing times are 5-7 business days and final review processing is 7-10 business days. Currently there are 4,022 licensed technologists in the state. I have reached out to Michael Odgren about speaking at convention. I also reached out to other radiologist groups looking for speakers.

Jeskan McGovern, secretary-treasurer: I have drafted and posted notes from the July meeting and CD renewal votes. I have spoken to Newman University students about involvement in the KSRT and 2025 convention, and I attended the ASRT Educator's Institute in September, which allowed me to

learn more about ASRT's work and the benefits of membership.

Approval of minutes: Jeskan previously emailed past meeting minutes to Denise. Denise determined there were edits needed. Jeskan will correct the minutes and email them out. An email vote then will be established to approve the minutes.

Financial report: The report was available to board members before the meeting. Denise provided an explanation of each category on the financial report. A couple of key points: The ASRT alternate delegate category is blank because Gale Brown's employer paid her expenses. The ASRT affiliate category was added to provide details about how the society spent the \$5,000 awarded to us. The KSRT currently is financially stable. Harmony motioned to approve the financial report, Dixie seconded, no discussions, motion passed.

Old business

2025 convention: Dixie said the food cost may be closer to \$7,500. Plated food options were discussed and decided that would be the best option. Chicken, beef, and a meatless option are preferred. Denise mentioned we need to make sure that the people who request special diets get what they requested. At the last convention, someone requested a gluten-free meal, and those options were gone by the time the student went to get food. We still need help with speakers. Kyle continues reaching out to groups. Mike Odgren was given speaker forms to turn in. Dixie said Dr. Landes will be a speaker. Shanna will email Connie Wagers with Stormont-Vail Flint Hills to see if she can help with possible speakers. The convention will be April 3-5 at the Hilton Garden Inn in Manhattan. The Manhattan Convention Center has offered name tags, lanyards, charging stations, and welcome bags. The name tag examples seem more Manhattan focused. Kelly will ask them if there is an option to add the KSRT logo. Make sure a book your hotel room early before the block of rooms sell out.

2026 convention: Becky talked to the Hilton Garden Inn in Hays about room setup options. Vendors did not love the setup at the 2023 convention. Suggestions, thoughts, and ideas are needed.

RA update: Toni has been emailing Dana with the ARRT. There are forms that need to be completed for financial assistance, and they are willing to help. What does that help look like? Toni also is working with ASRT to start the process of Day on the Hill, and she would like feedback to determine what day works best to ensure we have people and students able to attend. We would possibly set up in the rotunda at the Capitol with flyers and a snack and talk to legislators as they walk by.

ASRT financial assistance: The ASRT now requires us to provide them with information that shows how we spent the money given to us. Denise added a category to the financial report to help keep track of this. What other things can we use this money for? Denise suggested lapel microphones for speakers during convention. Currently they seem to run between \$100-\$200. Kyle suggested we start by purchasing one because we don't know how compatible they will be with convention locations. Dixie said she has had problems before with compatibility with different computer software. More research is needed into the lapel mics before purchasing. Dixie bought up the possibility of purchasing banners for the head table and registration table, either a vertical or horizontal banner with KSRT logo that can be used for convention or any other KSRT event.

Executive secretary vacancy: Denise will be stepping down as the executive secretary at the end of May, which coincides with the end of the KSRT's fiscal year. Only past presidents are eligible to serve as executive secretary. Dixie suggested that an email go out to all past presidents. There are members on the current board that qualify for the position.

CD renewal: The board voted to rollover our 9-month CD. Denise

completed the rollover with Sunflower Bank. Afterward, the bank sent a letter stating the CD was renewed at 0.449%, which was confusing. Denise visited Sunflower Bank, and they agreed to redeem the CD and start a new 6-month CD at 4.3% with a \$15 penalty.

Video: Toni spoke to someone in Mass Media, and they gave her the name of the faculty member that she needs to talk to. She will continue to work on this.

New business

Rad Tech Week: There was a discussion at the executive meeting about things we could do for Rad Tech Week. Kelly will email Shanna with examples of what they sent out last year for a contest. Shanna will take care of putting something together and submit it by Nov. 3. The contest will end at the end of November, the prize being a one-year KSRT membership. Denise motioned to provide a one-year free membership. Harmony seconded.

Motion passed unanimously.

Heart of America Professional

Network (HAPN): HAPN is an organization that addresses the problem of potential impairment among various professional groups in Kansas. Toni understands that the program is paid for by a stipend from the State of Kansas. KSRT will receive the bills, and those bills will be paid by the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts. This is a long process, and Toni is working to get this program going for the radiology technologists in Kansas. Also, we need to submit three names to the KSBHA to be on the rad council.

Life membership: Denise discussed the need for a formal process to give out life memberships. Currently we do not have a set process. Denise will reach out to other affiliates to get ideas on how they determine life members.

ASRT Senior Delegate: Currently there is only one applicant, Gale Brown. She meets the requirements and did well at the last meeting. There was no discussion. Shanna motioned to accept Gale as our new ASRT senior delegate for the next three years.

Kyle seconded. Motion passed.

Announcements

The winter board meeting will be at 10 a.m. Jan. 18 via Zoom.

The deadline for The Rotating Anode is Nov. 11. Jen asked what she should do with the old KSRT laptop. She will bring it to the convention and give it to Denise, whose husband, Mark, will clear the hard drive of data and donate or recycle the laptop.

Reminder to vote for Jen Smith for CT Chapter Chair during the ASRT elections.

Becky asked about the service project for the 2025 convention. Harmony and Kyle suggested something relating to the military and suicide prevention. They will see what they can find out.

Kirsten needs a list of current radiology program directors. Denise will email the list.

Toni is mentoring a student. Her name is Julia Wilson.

One student from Washburn submitted an SLDP application.

Adjournment: Toni motioned to adjourn meeting. Dixie seconded. Meeting adjourned at 11:21 a.m.

related. The 2026 convention will be in Hays.

New business:

Radiologist assistant update: This is being approached as a “stand alone” profession. Toni has been communicating with ASRT and ARRT about getting funding to push this issue forward in Kansas. KSRT will not move forward with this legislation without financial support from ASRT and/or ARRT. Toni requested feedback from radiologist groups to support the RA profession. A “day on the hill” tentatively will be in February 2025 in the rotunda to promote the RA profession.

ASRT Financial Assistance program: A list of needs included making a KSRT promotional video, funding portions of the day on the hill, wireless microphones, KSRT vinyl banner, and a new laptop for Jen Smith for *The Rotating Anode*.

2025 convention: Heidi and Jeskan will work ideas for selling KSRT convention T-shirts.

ASRT House of Delegates: Toni Caldwell, Gale Brown, and Denise Orth attended. The largest issue that was tabled was midlevel providers (PAs and APRNs) performing fluoro exams. The Connecticut society wants to prevent PAs and APRNs from performing fluoroscopy exams, reserving these studies exclusively for RAs. Remote MR imaging also was discussed and how patient care technicians

are the ones physically present during the scans instead of an RT. ASRT currently does not support remote patient scanning. While it is ASRT's current position statement, it is not yet mentioned in the practice standards.

Radiologic technology education was discussed and many schools are moving away from bachelor's degrees and toward associate's degrees because of the shortage of technologists. Military radiographers hold a technical certificate and not an associate's degree. This prevents them from being hired on in advanced modalities in hospitals after they leave the military.

Vacancy for executive secretary: Denise will be leaving this role May 31.

Other business:

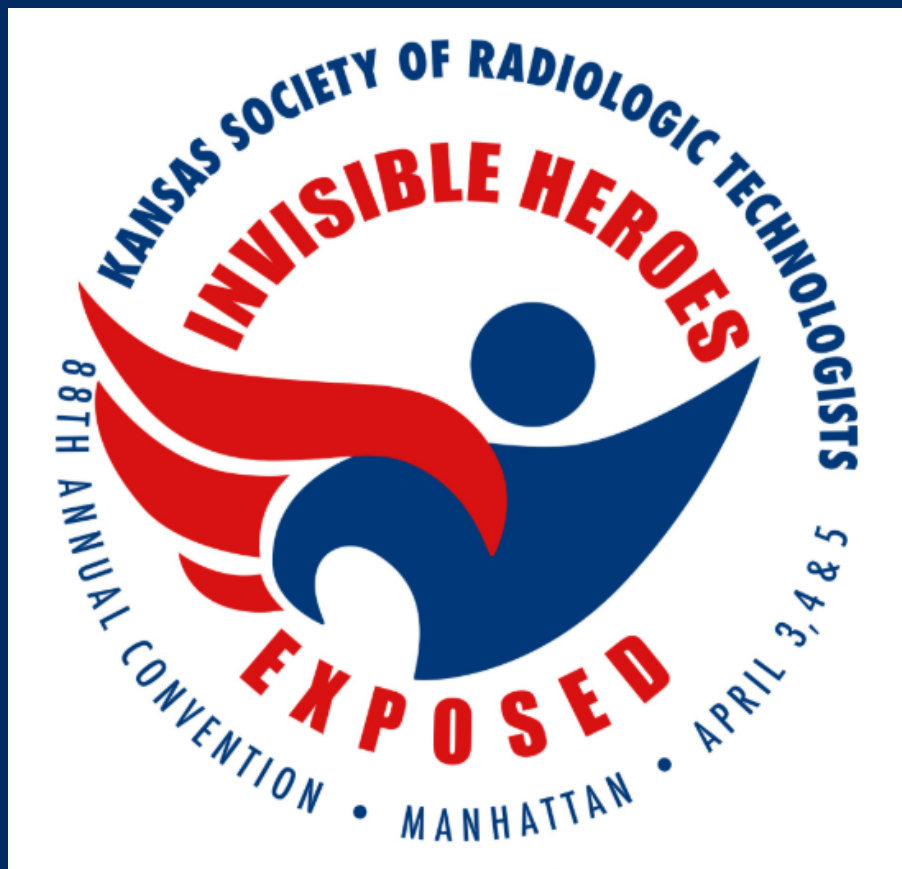
Video for KSRT: Jumping off the national “Be Seen” campaign would be beneficial. Denise recommended getting students more involved.
